Draft Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council held on 18th June 2018 at Brompton Village Hall commencing at 7.40pm

Present, Cllr S Triffitt (Chairman), Cllr Mrs M.K. Stockill, Cllr Mr S Willbourne, Cllr Mrs Cllr J Gray, Cllr D Jeffels, E. Steele (Clerk), 2 parishioners.

Apologies for absence: Mr R Carey (Vice Chairman), Cllr Mr M Evans, Cllr Mr D Landi, Cllr Mrs H Phillips

1 The Chairman opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. He mentioned that it was disappointing that the Forge Tea rooms application was passed by the planning department.

3 Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on 21st May 2018 were accepted as a true and accurate record and signed by the Chairman.

5 Declarations of interest – None

6 Police report- PC Locky mentioned that Vehicles were parking outside the Tavern blocking the pedestrian crossing. There is a blind person that relies on the bumps of the crossing to know where to cross and has been unable to, due to inconsiderate parking. Please keep this area clear. There has been two reports of an Assault by a pupil on staff at Brompton Hall School.

7 Report by Borough/County Councillor(s). – Cllr Jeffels will be granting some funds from the locality budget for the church clock refurb. He explained that a site visit had been carried out by the planning department to the Forge Tea Rooms and that although a very constructive argument was made by himself and objectors unfortunately the planning was still granted. He is hoping that a local builder will purchase the site so that the parish can form a relationship with the builder so that the development is carried out to a good standard. He had made a site visit to Garage Yard after concerns were raised of tree felling and is now in hand. Also his report included that, a seminar held at the Town Hall a few days ago revealed that trafficking is being carried out in the Scarborough Borough with hotels being used. This worrying issue is being investigated by organisations including the Clinical Commissioning Group. The seminar also revealed that children living in poverty in the Scarborough area is "a significant issue". Scarborough Council is seeking issues from members for issues which might be appropriate to be investigated in the Borough. The council have suggested declining rural services and their impact on villages, generating civic pride in the Borough, especially the town centre streets many of which suffer

from vegetation growing in the footpaths and have, as a result, an air of neglect; and the possibility of accommodation in two and three storey properties above shops, being converted into living accommodation which would help regenerate the town centre. Visits are being made to the primary schools in the Division - Snainton, Wykeham, Seamer and Irton, Brompton and East Ayton to ascertain how Cllr Jeffels might be able to offer help as the County Councillor for the area.

8 Open Forum

Elaine Mudd asked the clerk to contact the caretaker to mend the flower tub at the bottom of Sawdon and she also raised concerns of on going matters at Garage Yard which is now in hand. Mary Jones mentioned that the open gardens was most successful raising £1266 for the church and £500 for the village hall, with funds still to be added. She mentioned how nice it was for the school to get involved in the open gardens. Mary had been contacted by Brompton Hall school to ask if they can carry out community work at the Butts. The chairman said they can keep around the Oak trees tidy. Also Mary mentioned about the pull out information page 'dates for your diary' in the newsletter is very useful.

9 Highways matters -

Email from Andrew Santon regarding proposed bench at the War Memorial read out by clerk.

Email from Andrew Santon regarding the large tree at the bottom of Sawdon Lane is diseased and needs to come down, the council agreed to this.

The PC discussed that the road side grass cutting needs to be carried out and some areas at the Butts.

(2) Update on the Councils current financial position - The Clerk updated the Council on its current financial situation. It had a total of £33637.72p in the bank at the end of May 2018 and £4812.57p in the business saver account.

12 Brompton and Sawdon Village Halls

Brompton Village Hall. – After the annual village ventures meeting it was agreed that the kitchen requires a refurb and there is an empty space to fill where the boiler was, this will create more workspace. This will be carried out over August. After the village Hall meeting was held Mary Jones is in charge of the wellbeing section and is to enhance support sessions, Allison Tubbs is going to hold an Alzheimer's support morning. The AGM will be held next month.

Sawdon Village Hall - Damage has been caused possibly by a vehicle/ trailer, to the village hall. The bannister rail at the second door has been reversed into causing the rail to be pushed through to the inside interior wall of the village Hall causing damage. To go through insurance would still be costly and 'no claims' would be lost therefore the repairs will come out of the village hall funds. The police have been informed with details.

13 Update on attendance at outside meetings - Cllr Willbourne attended the CAPS meeting, he mentioned that there is an increase in burglaries in unlocked buildings and advises that they are locked up. Figures are low although will show an increase when the way crime incidents are recorded differently. To install surveillance cameras requires a large amount of Admin work that comes under the abbreviation of 'Ripper' although wildlife cameras can be installed with out having to go through the administration that is required of surveillance cameras.

14 The Butts, Brompton - A tree survey needs to be carried out at the Butts. A limb off a tree had fallen, Martin Tubbs and the chairman are in the process of clearing this.

15 Sawdon Community Nature Reserve - Craig Powell was unable to attend the meeting due to ill health but is working on the survey and has arranged for the logs to be moved into the agreed places by the PC.
